Die geplante Ausstellung "Mehr als Gold" (Museum Rietberg Zürich, 22. März bis 21. Juli 2024) wurde vom Los Angeles County Museum of Art konzipiert. Nebst Werken aus der eigenen Sammlung wie auch solchen aus anderen amerikanischen Museen (Museum of Fine Arts Houston, Metropolitan Museum of Art u.a.) werden darin über 200 Objekte aus dem Museo del Oro in Bogotá (Kolumbien) präsentiert.

Diese Ausstellung wurde unter dem Titel "Portable Universe – Thought and Splendor of Indigenous Colombia" auch im Museum of Fine Arts Houston und im Museum of Fine Arts Montreal gezeigt, immer mit Beteiligung des kolumbianischen Leihgebers. Das Museum Rietberg ist die vierte Station.

Die Begriffe "Inventory", "Binder" oder "Album" beziehen sich auf die diversen Quellendokumente des Museum of Fine Arts Houston.




